

# Voodoo Fe'

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- A self-taught painter & graphic designer, Voodoo Fe' has succeeded in establishing a distinct & recognizable style. Known for his use of beer bottle caps, his creations maintain a distinct signature style. Forever the nonconformist, Fe's paintings find their expression on discarded doors, pieces of wood, and mattresses reflecting his central theme to show the potential & often unacknowledged value of things deemed worthless.
- The popularity of Voodoo Fe's art is undeniable as his artwork can be seen in various places all over NYC, New Jersey & Virginia. His creations transcend cultural boundaries finding homes in the popular Lower East Side nightlife and renowned galleries in Chelsea. He has been a featured artist in Adult Icon's Heather Hunter's Artcore NYC and is a frequent contributor to Sound of Art exhibitions.
- Regarded as one of the industry's edgiest, most innovative and distinct artists, Voodoo Fe' Leon Mathelier has forged a career that transcends music genres & artistic mediums. Expressing his colorful imagination through sketches of interesting little characters or designs of unique fashions, Mathelier found both escape & acceptance through art, fashion & music.
- He is quite remarkable as a successful artist who is also bipolar, dyslexic, been homeless with 10 surgeries to his name. It's not every day you meet an African-American artist who turns his life around to produce 7,000 works of art in multiple mediums.





Born in Columbus, Ohio, Corbellic is currently based in Los Angeles where he commissions artwork and performs live paintings for celebrities & start-ups. Corbellic embodies “the spirit” of Jean Michel Basquiat, George Condo & pays respect to street art influencers. Corbellic’s art style is also influenced by the popular culture & current events by using acrylic, spray paint, oil sticks & resin.
- Being creative and exposed to Art has always been a passion for him, so he moved to Los Angeles for the performing Arts right after College. After pursuing his acting career, he worked as a Finance Analyst but returned to his childhood roots by expressing himself creatively. Although he had never been formally educated in the technique of Fine Art, he had day-dreamed of colors and shapes since birth which navigates his bold choices.
- Living in LA has given him the opportunity to create custom art for celebrity clients such as Allen Iverson, Deon Cole, Brent Faiyaz, & Matt Barnes. He has also had solo shows & art exhibits at the exquisite Mama Lounge & A-List Music Co.

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- After his freshman year in college, Ridley put his biotechnology studies on hold to pursue a two-year robotics apprenticeship at a fabrication studio at the Brooklyn Navy Yard, where he continued to hone his innovative yet conventional approach to art.





# Eddy Bogaert

- Eddy Bogaert is a mixed media painter who draws inspiration from nightlife & pop-culture. His paintings are interactive & have discreet subliminal messages, which can only be seen under black light. Often working with the themes of “public persona” and “the truth,” Eddy explores these concepts by creating each piece as a series of layers utilizing a variety of mediums.
- Eddy is of Belgian & Dominican descent. Living in New York, he has always been surrounded by diversity, culture & experienced life in different countries. His art is very similar to life - with many layers. He adds complexities to his artwork by his own experiences, influences & contrasting aesthetics. He draws inspiration from high fashion, street art & the glamour of city nightlife.
- His complex style & pieces go beyond just what you see. To suggest his work is simply as “mixed media” is only the tip of the iceberg. His pieces exist on several planes at the same time & is a portal into different dimensions that require guests to use 3-D glasses, blacklight and normal lighting to experience. His art recently caught the eye of Wilhemina Models NY and used his art for a New York Fashion Week campaign.





- “When I'm walking around, I just people watch and imagine what everyone's lives are like. Something you hate about your life, someone else might be dying for.” In a certain piece, DeGrasse shares how her emotions after a bad breakup, drove the color and shapes within her pieces. She explains how there was no particular plan for the piece and everything came together in a spur of the moment.
